Resolved

- that teacher-educators might change or modify some of the heads in the presented format in conformity with the content-materials or the nature of the lesson and its approach. However, the basic pattern/ structure in both the macro and micro lesson plans should be followed.
- that practice teaching for at least 40 days should be held in the selected schools under the care and control of the heads of the respective institutes.
- that a student must deliver at least 40 planned lessons, duly approved by the concerned teacher educators. Of these 40 lessons in the minimum, 10 on each subject like Bengali/First Language, English (L2), Mathematics and EVS.
- that internal assessment on the executed lessons should be made through class room observation and examination of merit of the plans.
- that for final evaluation (external) on Practice Teaching (Macro Lessons) one lesson plan from each of the four subject areas apart from those planned, approved, executed and evaluated internally, should be presented for evaluation by the external evaluators. Out of these four lessons, a student is required to demonstrate two lessons in the final evaluation programme. One of these two lessons must be a language lesson.
- that for internal evaluation on the micro lessons, two lessons on each of the five skills are to be
 prepared and presented during the course. Such lessons should range over the four subject
 areas, namely Mother Language, English, Mathematics and EVS in a well balanced way.

- that for external evaluation in the micro teaching area another fresh set of five lessons on the five micro teaching skills should be made ready for presentation, leading to assessment by examiners, appointed by the WBBPE.
- that the new pattern and procedures are to be effective from 2012-14 onward batches in both
 the face-to-face and ODL modes of the Course including the One Year Bridge Course for inservice teachers who have cleared one year PTT Course, excepting the evaluation techniques
 and pattern, since the ODL courses have their own evaluation techniques and patterns.
- that the 2011-13 batch under the WBBPE be also imparted the new approach, method, techniques and skills as far as practicable in view of the fact that they are also going to teach under the same new syllabus and approach in near future in the govt-run primary schools in West Bengal.
- that the following steps should be taken up for planning a lesson in accordance with the constructivism-approach as exposed in the new syllabus, curriculum and text materials.

Steps to be followed for design of lessons

- a) Identifying the concepts & process in the Text.
- b) Assessing previous knowledge/diagnosing misconceptions of the learner.
- c) Co-construction of activities along with work sheet.
- d) Forming heterogeneous group & assigning task.
- e) Planning for facilitating group work.
- f) Consciously following all the steps-ENGAGEMENT / EXPLORATION / EXPLANATION.
- g) Negotiation to build up interpretation.
- h) Learner's EVALUATION as per proposed format for CCE.
- Further resolved that the following marking scheme for assessment of performances
 of the student-teachers in the face-to-face mode be accepted with effect from
 2012-14 session.

10 lessons on the selected five skills, i.e. two each on every skill : 10 x 4 marks = 40 Presentation on any two skills out the five selected skills : 2 x 5 marks = 10

Demonstration on two skills before the external evaluator : 2 x 25 marks = 50

Mode of presentation, creating an interactive environment
